Reception Curriculum Newsletter – Term 6

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the final Reception curriculum newsletter.

Our new topic question is: -

'Why do we travel in different ways?'



***Are you ready for an adventure? Where in the world could we go? How could we travel there?
It's time to discover transport, travel, and places near and far!***

This term, we will explore how many forms of transport we can use.
We will place transport photographs in chronological order and add captions.

We will be thinking about the transport we've taken to go on holiday, we'll use maps to consider where we'd like to visit next. What should we pack? We'll draw and write about imaginary journeys.

We will make predictions and check how many vehicles we can find on the school grounds.

We'll accompany stories and songs about transport with music and movement. We will learn about floating and sinking by building miniature boats and find out about friction by rolling cars down ramps. We will also talk about road safety and learn about high-visibility clothing. **AND we will go on our trip to the Miniature Railway on the 25th of June!**

Home Learning Project

- Why not explore your local neighbourhood together and take photos of exciting vehicles and create a poster labelling your photos.
- Create a pictogram or tally chart of all the different types of transport that pass your front window within a set amount of time.
- Or why not build an imaginary vehicle? How will it move? Why is different to normal vehicles?

Your child may wish to come up with their own idea for their home learning project. She/he may wish to complete their project by themselves or need your support in completing their project - either is fine and we look forward to see them.

Parents and carers should record the daily reading activity in your child's reading record.
